SALTO Participation and Information:

"(Youth) participation in democratic life is about individual (young people) and groups (of young people)

having the right, the means, the space, the opportunity and, where necessary, the support...



...to freely express their views, contribute to and influence societal decision-making on matters affecting them, and be active within the democratic and civic life of our communities."




Is it "participation"?

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

Schools within DEMOCRACY

DEMOCRACY within schools

Schools are the first substantial contact of a learner with a **public institution**

Can be the place where people **develop trust** in **good governance**, public services

Schools can demonstrate the value of education as a **'public good'** and a benefit of a **democratic society**

Learning environments are where **democratic culture** can be fostered and appreciated



Schools within democracy

CITIZENSHIP EDUCATION (also called HUMAN RIGHTS EDUCATION, CIVIC EDUCATION)

Developing specific competences required for young people's active citizenship

Implicitly contains ideas about how learners "should" actively engage in democracy and be a "good" citizen

Enhancing critical thinking, media literacy

Offer opportunities for civic engagement / linking to democratic processes outside of schools

Values

- Valuing human dignity and human rights
- Valuing cultural diversity
- Valuing democracy, justice, fairness, equality and the rule of law

Attitudes

- Openness to cultural otherness and to other beliefs, world views and practices
- Respect
- Civic-mindedness
- Responsibility
- Self-efficacy
- Tolerance of ambiguity

Competences for Democratic Culture

- Autonomous learning skills
- Analytical and critical thinking skills
- Skills of listening and observing
- Empathy


Reality: The rightward shift in Europe
