

1 ESC background & context

The European Student Card Initiative (ESCI)

The European Student Card Initiative (ESCI) is composed of three building blocks: *Erasmus+ App, Erasmus Without Paper (EWP)*, and the *European Student Card (ESC)*.



- Find information about services, events and accommodation in the host higher education institution;
- Find tips, stories and student offers across Europe.












- Fill learning agreements digital;
- Easily update learning agreements without inperson visits;
- Enjoy a streamlined, transparent and efficient mobility process.
- Access physical and digital services during student mobility (i.e. transport, bookshops, accommodation, etc) in home and host country;
- Verify student status quickly and in a secure manner anywhere in Europe;
- Avoid requesting a new student card when in mobility.








#### A look into the ESC

The European Student Card started as an EU-funded project in 2016 to promote student mobility and participation in educational and cultural activities, as well as to reduce administrative and mobility costs for students and education institutions. The aim is that, by 2025, all European students benefit from an ESC either in their pocket or digitally on their phone.

## Council Recommendation 5<sup>th</sup> April 2022 on building bridges for effective European higher education cooperation

- Identifies the European Student Card Initiative (ESCI) as a key action to achieve this ambition by simplifying administration for institutions;
- Calls on the Commission and Member States to work together to widen the ESCI;
- Supports new emerging mobility cooperation models;
- Encourages higher education institutions to make full use of digital tools for mobility.





**Benefits of the ESC** 

The European Student Card introduces a **common European identity for higher education students** so that their student status can be easily verified across Europe when in mobility abroad.



- Simplify access to on- and off-campus services during mobility with their existing student card.
- Added European dimension to their student status.



## Card issuers/ higher education institutions

- Avoid the need to issue a new student card for mobile students.
- Securely validate the student status of incoming mobility students.




## **Student service providers**

- Streamline the verification of student status.
- Gain access to a wider network of users



#### **European Student Card features**

Depending on the institution issuing the card, the ESC can be in a **digital** or **a physical format** and can be integrated into student cards **with any type of technology** (e.g., chip technology, magnetic stripe, etc). The ESC can be issued **directly** by the higher education institution or **co-branded**. The ESC is composed of the following features:



#### **European Student Card logo**

Combines the European identity (text & flag) with the QR code. It facilitates the implementation and recognition of the ESCs

#### **ESCN - European Student Card Number**

Unique card identifier that serves to link a specific card to the specific higher education institution who produced it and to identify a card

#### **ESI - European Student Identifier**

Unique identifier that allows to link a given student to a specific ESC. It is not recommended to be printed on the card.




\*Active card: it means that the registration process has been completed and the institution has issued an ESC with both the hologram and QR code updated to the ESC-Router.



#### Where ESCs are issued:

- 15 EU MS and third countries associated to the E+ Programme issuing ESCs
- **3** Third countries not associated to the E+ Programme issuing ESCs
- 16 EU MS and third countries associated to the E+ Programme not issuing ESC, but connected to the ESC-R

When is the new ESC-R going to be available?




The current ESC-R and a revamped user interface will be migrated to the European Commission's cloud on October 23rd.

## The ESC-Router

The ESC-Router is a platform that allows higher education institutions and other card issuers to manage and issue ESCs, as well as verify student status.

## **ESC-R Migration**

- **User data** and **cards** will be **migrated** (users that meet the T&Cs)
- The ESC-R will be available at the same web address
- Following the migration, users will be prompted upon their first log-in to accept the updated legal documents that regulate the new ESC-R



## **HOW DOES THE ESC WORK?**

How to issue the ESC in the new ESC-R?

The card issuing and activation process is made possible by the **ESC Router (ESC-R)\***, which is a database that stores basic information on European Student Cards', allowing higher education institutions and other card issuers to manage and issue ESC, and enabling the validation of student status.





<sup>\*</sup> The acceptance of legal documents occurs within the new ESC-R.

<sup>\*\*</sup> The ESCN can be generated by the institution in its own system, or (if left empty) automatically generated by the ESC-R.

## **HOW DOES THE ESC WORK?**

#### Student status verification

This process includes the **demand of services** from the student to the student service provider and the **verification of student status**. Three main ways currently exist to verify student status through the ESC: the ESC hologram, the QR code, or manually through the website.



The cardholder is interested in a service and presents their student card to the service provider




The student service provider verifies the student status through:


#### Student card ecosystem

Information was collected to understand the current student card ecosystem and state-of-play of ESC adoption in Latvia.



#### **Current Student Card System**

- Latvian higher education institutions either issue student ID cards on their own or in collaboration with ISIC, which provides a wide range of discounts and benefits in Latvia and abroad (in theatres, museums, clubs, shops, cafes, etc.).
- Generally, student cards in Latvia offer on-campus services such as access to university buildings and facilities.
- Some cards can also be used as bank credit cards as a result of partnerships between the institutions, ISIC and Swedbank. They also issue multi-service cards that allow for payments in-store and online and modern contactless payments by smartphone (digital card).




#### **ESC EXPERIENCE**

#### Format of student cards: Digital and Physical

- 21 students (4%) that answered the survey in Latvia have an ESC
- Of 21 students with an ESC, 1 had a digital card, 14 a physical card, and 6 had both (digital and physical).
- 33% of students that have digital ESCs store them in their in their phone's wallet

#### **ESC AWARENESS**








94% of students and card issuers that were not aware of the ESC are interested in implementing it, as most of them believe it will increase the availability of services.


#### **ESC SERVICES**


According to the overall survey's responses, the **offline services** mostly accessed **through ESCs** included:











Access to library services

**43%** of **students** who have an ESC have **access to offline services** through the ESC.

3 out of 21 students that have an ESC use other cards to access services (ISIC).


What is the new ESC logo?

The new ESC logo facilitates the implementation and recognition of European Student Cards. It will be accompanied by a graphic charter to ensure its consistent use.

## **Benefits of the new ESC logo**

- Implement the new ESC logo easily with no external costs;
- Provides a flexible and secure solution for student status verification;
- Reinforces the idea of a **collective identity for European students** with the EU flag;
- The combination of the QR code and logo takes up less space, and the horizontal and vertical layout options ensure increased compatibility with student cards; and,
- Adaptable to both digital and physical cards.

\*The QR code on an ESC contains the European Student Card Number and the URL needed to validate the card.

Digital version

The launch of the new ESC logo will be followed by a coexistence phase until end of December 2027, where both the previous version of the ESC logo (with the hologram) and the new ESC logo can be issued. **As of January 2028, new cards issued must have the new ESC logo.**






