



Flexible learning possibilities



Navigating the challenges

- + NEET rate among 18-24y is 9.8%
- + High drop-out rate in VET
- + The share of boys is much higher among low achievers and secondary education dropouts.
- + Differing paths in secondary education are not equally valued. Do we need common upper secondary education standard?
- + Lack of qualified vocational educators and specialists



Vocational education reform

to enhance VET's appeal to better align with future trends, expand choices after graduation, and ensure a longer-lasting skill set.

NEW VET LAW in 2024

- + Extended study duration
- + New concept for secondary education
- + Emphasis on cross-disciplinary skills
- + Comprehensive, individualised curricula
- + Practical skill assessments

- + Regional education centers to provide wide range of learning pathways
- + Competency-based division of schools
- + New funding mechanisms

- + Makes changes to start reforms
- + New VET Law for 2027 to perpetuate the new concept

Priority topics of the VET Team

In 2022-2024, VET team focuses on the following priority topics:

- Individual and flexible learning pathways
- Skills-based approach in VET
- Green transition and the development of green skills in VET
- Enhancing the quality of KA1 and KA2 projects in VET
- Facilitating knowledge sharing and networking among VET institutions in the establishment of Centers of Vocational Excellence (CoVEs)
- Democratic culture in VET (new topic in 2024)

Main achievements in 2023 (1)

Green transition and green skills in VET sector:

- a) Regular **vision webinars** (once a month) **"Green Mornings"** on green transition in VET
- **b)** Support materials for VET institutions on green transition
- c) Field meeting in south-east Estonia
- d) Thematic seminar on sustainability/green transition in VET in October 2023, Tallinn
- e) Policy recommendations on green transition in VET



Main achievements in 2023 (2)

Enhancing the quality of KA1 & KA2 applications (and consequently the quality of projects) through training and advice on the use of learning outcomes and recognition in VET:

- a) Survey on development of key competences of VET students through international mobility
- b) Thematic seminar on learning outcomes for KA1 project coordinators in VET
- c) Summer/winter school for KA1 project coordinators in VET

Main achievements in 2023 (3)

Regional/EU cooperation:

- Baltic NAs meeting in August 2023 in Haapsalu, Estonia
- Baltic VET Team coordinators meeting in December 2023 in Riga
- Study trip to Finland in October 2023
