Work package 1. Training and advice (national tasks 2023)

National VET team organized and supported the following events:

- 1. Webinar to follow-up the implementation of the vocational unit on internationalization (Working in an international work environment, 15 cp) and to support quality assurance and implementation of recognized mobility. (March 2023).
 - > 68 participants online + a presentation has been watched approx. 100 times.
- 2. Workshop to promote EU vocational tools and to exchange best practices between VET providers in both decentralised and centralised Erasmus+ projects (April 2023).
 - > 62 participants
- 3. Workshop was part of the Erasmus+ VET summer days to reach all Erasmus+ project coordinators to exchange best practices between VET providers in E+ projects. (1½ days event: June 2023)
 - > 80 Erasmus+ project coordinators as participants





Work package 1. Training and advice (national tasks 2023)

- 4) Webinar aimed especially at management of in VET providers to promote European possibilities for strategic international mobility and development.

 The programme and invitations were headed especially to directors, headmasters, heads of units and planners. The need to reach the management is crucial, as the long-term impact of internationality originates with strategic approach. (October 2023).
 - > 78 participants
- 5) The Internationalisation Days of VET gathered international coordinators and VET teachers to learn about European VET policies and develop the international activities also though peer learning. (2 days seminar: November 2023)
 - > 136 participants







Work package 1. Training and advice (national tasks 2024)

- 1) Overview of the implementation of the vocational unit of internationalization; Web article about the implementation of the vocational unit on internationalization (Working in an international work environment, 15 cp.) The aim is to evaluate and disseminate the quality and the recognition of the vocational unit on internationalization during the Erasmus+ mobility periods.
- 2) "From data gathering to knowledge management" seminar: Erasmus as a tool for strategic internationalization: How to implement high-quality processes and follow up. How to plan and measure progress in all key activities. (17.4.2024 Helsinki)
 - > 54 participants
- 3) Seminar as part of Erasmus+ VET Summer Days event; disseminating and promoting EU tools in Erasmus projects. Expected 80 participants (6.-7.6.2024 Helsinki)





Work package 1. Training and advice (national tasks 2024)

- 4) Webinar for the management of the vocational institutions aiming to promote international opportunities in order to enhance international engagement and commitment. Expected 30 participants. (Q4/2024)
- 5) Two-days conference Internationalisation Days of VET to support the peer learning of the VET institutions as E+ beneficiaries and applicants; The objective is to encourage the VET applicants to enhance the EU VET tools for the mobility activities and support the use other actual tools for the mobility and co-operation projects; to produce knowledge and understanding of quality in VET; to disseminate best practices via project marketplace.

 Expected participants 130. (30.-31.10.2024 Lahti)


